So you need not prepare or study in advance. The evening programs are enjoyable, accessible and stress-free. In an effort to encourage a fun, easy-going, friendly, casual atmosphere, dance instructions will not be available.

- Challenging Workshop for Experienced Dancers
Big Hall with Bare Necessities

The Challenging Workshop is not suitable for beginners and features more challenging/unusual/uncommon dances aimed at experienced dancers, while the Review Session includes tips and style points for more enjoyable dancing and is for anyone who would like to be better prepared for Saturday night.

Please be advised that the Challenging Workshop in the Big Hall requires a high degree of confidence in basic figures (e.g., double figure-eights, cross-over mirror heys, heys for 3 & 4) & some familiarity with more advanced/unusual figures (e.g., chevrons). Dancers are expected to dance the basic figures without assistance; talk-thru's & walk-thru's will be brief.

English Country Dance Weekend on the Vermont side of Lake Champlain

Saturday, June 10, 2017

10:30am to noon

“The Sublime Marriage of English Dance and Music”

Join us for a talk / presentation by Gene Murrow, to the musical accompaniment of Bare Necessities pianist, Jacqueline Schwab.

The English "country dance" as we know it today is an amalgamation of several genres, including folk / vernacular dances popular in the English countryside since the 16th century, court / cultured dances composed by the "dancing masters" of the 17th and 18th centuries, and the work of contemporary dancing masters composing dances in those traditions. Each contributes its own style of movement and vocabulary of patterns. With such a diverse inheritance, it's no wonder the music for the English country dance is as varied as it is. It includes the simple "traditional" jigs, reels and hornpipes used by many other Irish, Scottish, and American folk dance forms; art music by notable composers from the Renaissance, Baroque and Classical eras; popular tunes from every era; and newly composed music in a variety of styles. Our session will explore the remarkable connections between English country dance and its music.
